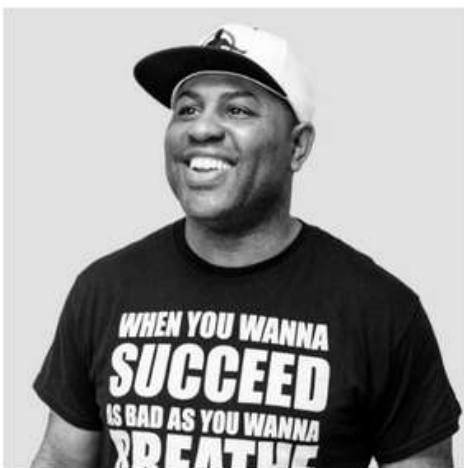

Some tidbits from these interactions:

Chris Auger

- o Leadership is about being available and approachable. Chris told us about the importance of rest and mediation in our daily cycle to avoid "emotional hijacking" by others.

- o Emotional intelligence is 60% of success.
- o The importance of letting your team know whether they have a view, voice, vote, or veto power on a team before you get into the details.
- o Letting your teams know that you have their best interest at heart before giving options on direction.
- o Hire intentionally. Be clear in your direction, or else the hire is asking to be course corrected.
- o Be intentional about having a healthy tension between work and life.
- o Accept your role in feedback.
- o Clearly “telegraph your value system.” Express it clearly, and no one will intentionally cross it.
- o Eliminate the why questions. Ask what and how to get it done.
- o Mentality shift- Appreciate what you have vs. what you want. Change tasks and chores to opportunities and habits.

John C. Maxwell

- o Leadership is not just applying the principles but multiplying the many.
- o You need to “get over yourself, to give yourself” to others in the leadership journey.
- o Key to connecting to people, “is knowing it isn’t about you.”
- o People can’t put themselves in their story if it is all about you.
- o Leadership is a journey with no endzone. It is a marathon.
- o Action Attraction- Action attracts opportunities and success. You can’t hope for success.
- o You never leave something. You are actually going to something. That something is purpose and focus.
- o “You give up to go up”- the greatest challenge in tomorrows success is todays excess.
- o Everything you want and need is outside of your comfort zone. There are tradeoffs all along the way. There is no top to the mountain. There is no end. You pay again, and again and again.
- o We have assumptions because we don’t ask questions.
- o Leverage the “open ear policy”
- o Communicators know it’s all about others.
- o Your first impression must be your best impression. No winging it.
- o Good communicators lead with their strength and use it often.

Eric Thomas

- o Know everyone’s “WHY” on the team, including yourself.
 - What values or behaviors are **non-negotiable for ME**, no matter the circumstance or situation?
- o Mix generations on a team to get a broader perspective.
- o Words matter. Make the words count.
- o You can not be better than others but be more developed- more primed.
- o Build your mentor list. Learn, develop, relearn, develop and share the wealth.
- o Someone is counting on YOU to step up and be all that you can possibly be.
- o Three keys to effective leadership
 - A Powerful WHY
 - Effective Communication
 - Strong Values

Patrick Lencioni

- o Know your gift, learn it, and share it.
- o Life is in thirds. 1/3 is work, 1/3 is your life, 1/3 is your sleep. Maximize balance to make them all feed each other intentionally.
- o Spend one hour on a subject for five years and you will be an expert on that subject.

Tim Elmore

- o Hard times build a strong generation, whereas good times build a weak generation.
- o Clarify your decision-making/communication norms to all.
- o Distinguish between preferences, expectations, and demands.
- o Match “modern elders” & “young geniuses” on task teams to bridge generational gaps.
- o Invite all generations to messaging copy meetings.
- o Launch “reverse mentoring” groups on your staff
- o With Gen Z
 - Trust must be earned
 - Relationship must be established
 - Incentive must be cultivated
 - Ownership must be given
 - Hope must be offered.

There were certainly a lot more, but hours and hours of this amazing feedback will be disseminated during a coffee break with Lion's Pride Leadership soon.

FBI and CISA Publish Advisory on Malicious Cyber Activity Against Election Infrastructure

A joint announcement was published by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) around malicious cyber activity for election infrastructure. The document mentioned that any compromises to infrastructure are unlikely to result in disruptions or prevent voting. FBI and CISA were able to block and mitigate risks with minimal or no disruption to election processes. They will continue to respond quickly to potential threats, provide recommendations and notify stakeholders about any dangers. Apart from the FBI and CISA, US Cyber Command (USCYBERCOM) and the National Security Agency (NSA) established a body called Election Security Group (ESG) to practice electoral procedures from any hacking and disinformation.

US DHS Grant Program Can Boost Local Governments' Cybersecurity Strength

The US Department of Homeland Security (DHS) announced the first cybersecurity grant program for state, local, and territorial (SLT) governments across the country to protect against the cyber threat. Funding for the State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program (SLCGP) and the Tribal Cybersecurity Grant Program (TCGP) will be regulated by the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). To qualify for funding, the SLTs must develop and establish appropriate governance structures, understand their current cybersecurity position, implement necessary security protections, and ensure that the personnel is trained in cybersecurity.
