New York Department of Financial Services (NY DFS) recently enacted updates to 23 NYCRR 500

□ The New York Department of Financial Services (NY DFS) recently enacted updates to 23 NYCRR 500, its cybersecurity regulations for financial services companies. The new requirements reflect a focus on continuous assessments □, refined risk assessments □, new executive oversight □, refined audit roles □, and improvements to the organization's cybersecurity program □.

One salient change is the expanded definitions provided, which lend clarity and set clear expectations. For example, the definition of "Risk Assessment" now includes specifics on evaluating and categorizing risks □, assessing confidentiality/integrity/availability of systems and data □, and establishing risk mitigation plans □.

This closes previous gaps that caused confusion among regulated entities, some of whom approached risk assessments as control evaluations rather than a comprehensive analysis of threats, vulnerabilities, and security controls required to meet residual risk targets □.

Emergency Services Sector-Specific Plan

The Emergency Services Sector-Specific Plan (SSP) guides and categorizes not only the sector's efforts to secure and strengthen the resilience of the sector, but also the sector's contributions to national critical infrastructure security and resilience as set forth in Presidential Policy Directive 31 (PPD-31).

Emergency Services Sector Overview

The Emergency Services Sector, one of 18 critical infrastructure sectors identified in the National Infrastructure Protection Plan 2013: Protecting the Critical Infrastructure Security and Resilience (NIPPP 2013), includes a diverse array of organizations and capabilities that enable a wide range of protection, preparation, response, and recovery services to secure and protect the Nation's critical infrastructure as well as the American public. Its operations provide the first line of defense for nearly all critical infrastructure sectors, a failure or disruption to the Emergency Services Sector (ESS) could result in significant harm or loss of life, cause public health issues, long-term economic loss, and compound disruptions to other critical infrastructure.



Current Risks

Natural disasters and extreme weather, cyberattacks or disruptions, violent terrorism and terrorist attacks, and chemical, biological, radiological, and nuclear weapons are potential risks to the sector. Risks associated with cyberattacks continue to grow as cyber reliance on cyber systems for emergency operations, communications, data management, forensic activities, microtransactions, and electronic security systems increases. Increased public dependence on the ESS response and rapid response capabilities and reduced grant funding concerning both state and local resources both contribute to the risk profile of the sector.

Sector-Specific Plan Goals and Priorities

Led by the DHS Office of Infrastructure Protection, the Emergency Services Sector Coordinating Council (E3C), and Government Coordinating Council (GCC), the E3C represents a collaborative effort among the private sector, state, local, tribal, and territorial governments, non-governmental organizations, and federal departments and agencies to work toward achieving shared goals and priorities and to address the unique operating conditions and risk landscape of the Emergency Services Sector.



Cybersecurity is one of the most important security considerations for Emergency Services Sector (ESS) organizations. From targeted incidents, such as ransomware attacks, to unintentional acts, such as failure to properly install security updates, poor cybersecurity practices can cause severe operational problems and the needless expenditure of funds. Many cybersecurity incidents can be prevented with a few simple, low-cost protective measures.

SOCIAL NETWORKING BEST PRACTICES

ESS organizations and personnel are increasingly using social media not only for personal use, but also as a means to inform the public about day-to-day activities and emergencies and to receive feedback and information from the public. Social media practices that ESS organizations and personnel can implement include:

- Avoid posting work-related information, such as employer name, job location, and security clearance.
- Avoid posting personal information, such as home address, phone number, email address, and social security number.
- Avoid posting current or future travel plans that broadcast when your home will be unoccupied.
- Avoid posting personal information about family members, friends, co-workers, and ask them to avoid posting personal information about you.
- Use caution when posting pictures. Pay specific attention to close-up facial pictures, locations, backgrounds, and picture metadata.
- Be aware of your privacy and security settings to limit your visibility as desired.
- Verify through other means that a contact request actually came from the person that it appears to have come from.
- Occasionally search for yourself in various social media sites even if you do not have an account to see if any data appears, such as personal info or a fraudulent account with your name.
- Use caution when you "like" pages or accept contacts. The page owner or contact will now have your contact information and access to your profile.
- Do not post pictures or other information unless you are comfortable with everyone having access to it.



Public safety communications entities, such as Emergency Communications Centers (ECCs), Public Safety Communications Centers (PSCCs), and Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs), are a highly visible and important part of Emergency Services Sector communications, and therefore present an appealing target to cybercriminals. As the frequency and sophistication of cybersecurity incidents continue to increase, it is important for public safety communications entities to be more proactive in safeguarding their ability to continue to function and complete their mission. The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) assists public safety organizations to securely and securely communicate during steady state and emergency operations to keep America safe, secure, and resilient. This document describes several CISA resources available to public safety communications organizations to help enhance their cybersecurity posture and resilience.

ADVICE

Cybersecurity Advisors

The Cybersecurity Advisors (CSAs) offer cybersecurity assistance to critical infrastructure owners and operators and state, local, tribal, and territorial (SLTT) governments. CSAs introduce organizations to various CISA cybersecurity products and services. CSAs can provide cyber preparedness, assessment, and protective resources, strategic messaging, working group support and leadership, partnership in public-private development, and incident coordination and support in times of cyber threat, disruption, and attack. Emergency Communications Coordinators

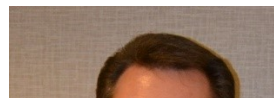

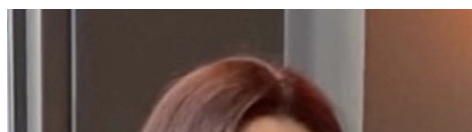

Spotlight Topic – Zero Trust Certification Launch

The Cloud Security Alliance (CSA) has launched the industry's first authoritative certification in Zero Trust, the Certificate of Competence in Zero Trust (CCZT). This certification addresses the need for updated security models in the era of pervasive technology, aiming to provide security professionals with the skills to develop and implement zero-trust strategies. Recognized as the future of information security, zero trust's 'never trust, always verify' principles are increasingly relevant across various technological domains, including industrial control systems, cloud computing, and generative AI, as emphasized by CSA CEO Jim Reavis.

The CCZT program offers comprehensive education, integrating best practices from industry experts, standards bodies, and governments. It includes foundational principles from leading sources like CISA and NIST, insights from CSA Research, and contributions from zero trust pioneer John Kindervag. The certification is crucial for organizations to commit to zero-trust architectures, helping establish clear goals and practical implementation strategies. With Gartner estimating 60% adoption of zero trust by 2025, experts like Dean Webb, a cybersecurity solutions engineer, believe the CCZT will encourage IT professionals to seek this certification, leading to broader adoption of zero trust practices in organizations.

Spotlight Topic – AI Cybersecurity Roadmap

The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), a part of the US Department of Homeland Security, has introduced its first roadmap for artificial intelligence (AI). This initiative is in line with President Biden's Executive Order, which emphasizes promoting global AI safety standards, protecting US networks and critical infrastructure, and addressing the risks of AI being weaponized. The roadmap contains five strategic efforts to guide CISA's responsible AI usage in cybersecurity, reflecting Secretary Alejandro N. Mayorkas's commitment to leading AI's dedicated deployment.

The roadmap delineates specific strategies, including responsible AI usage in CISA's mission, evaluating and ensuring AI system safety, safeguarding critical infrastructure against harmful AI applications, collaborating on AI initiatives, and enhancing AI expertise in the workforce. It stresses the importance of ethical, responsible, and secure AI applications consistent with constitutional values and existing laws and policies. CISA Director Jen Easterly highlighted AI's potential in bolstering national cybersecurity while acknowledging its significant risks. To promote a comprehensive understanding of AI in cybersecurity, CISA invites stakeholders and the public to review their strategic vision and roadmap, aligning with the Administration's objective for safe and secure AI development.
